CONSTITUTION 1 2 of the 3 FLORIDA FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA, INC. 4 (As Amended at the 88th State Convention, June 2016) 5 6 ARTICLE I 7 Names and Purposes 8 9 The name of this association shall be "The Florida Future Farmers of America, Inc." Members are hereinafter Section A -10 referred to as "FFA members." The letters "FFA" may be officially used to designate the Corporation, its chapters, 11 or members thereof. 12 Section B -The objectives and purposes of Florida FFA, Inc. are set forth in Section 3 of the National Organization's Charter, 13 Public Law 105-225 (formerly Public Law 81-740). Florida FFA, Inc. shall cooperate with national and state 14 15 governing agencies and officials in vocational education in accomplishing these objectives and purposes and the following aims and activities, which the governing body has determined, pursuant to Section 3(8) of the 16 Organization's Charter, to be appropriate aims and activities within the framework of objectives and purposes 17 established by the Organization's Charter: 18 19 To be an integral part of the organized instructional programs in agriculture, agribusiness and renewable 20 natural resources as qualify for assistance under federal vocational occupational education legislation. 21 22 23 To build the confidence of students in themselves and their work by developing desirable work habits and the effective use of their time by learning to assume responsibilities and by developing personal and 24 25 occupational competencies in communications, human relations and social abilities leading to intelligent 26 choices of careers and successful employment in agriculture. 27 To foster programs and activities which will develop leadership, character, scholarship and occupational 28 pride, training for useful citizenship, patriotism, thrift and the improvement in community life by 29 30 encouraging members to improve the home and its surroundings and to develop and improve the 31 community, including its economic, environmental, and human resources. 32 33 To recognize individual achievement in scholarship and occupational experience programs and other 34 individual achievements by providing awards to deserving members. 35 To procure for and distribute to federations, local chapters, and members, official FFA supplies and 36 37 equipment. 38 39 To publish official communication and publications for the members of Florida FFA, Inc. 40 To cooperate with others, including the Department of Education, in accomplishing the above purposes, 41 to engage in other activities, consistent with the foregoing purposes, determined by the Governing Board 42 to be in the best interest of Florida FFA, Inc. 43 44 45 **ARTICLE II** 46 Organization 47 Florida FFA, Inc. is an affiliated association of the National FFA Organization of, by, and for the students of 48 Section A -49 agricultural education. It shall consist of local chapters chartered by Florida FFA, Inc. in the State of Florida, 50 as authorized by the National FFA Organization, in accordance with the provisions in its by-laws. 51 Section B -Active chapters of the FFA for students enrolled in schools of less than college grade shall be chartered only 52 53 in schools where recognized systematic instruction in agricultural education is offered under the provisions 54 of the federal vocational education legislation. 55 56 Section C -Collegiate chapters may be chartered by the state association in two-or-four year postsecondary institutions 57 where agricultural courses are taught.

113 114 Section D -

Each chartered collegiate chapter may adopt a constitution which shall not conflict with that of the national organization or the respective state association, elect officers, and establish a Chapter Plan.

The collegiate chapter shall submit to the State Advisor an annual report covering program of work and achievements for the current school year, along with payment of State and National dues.

- Any group of agricultural education students whose number is not less than ten and where a chapter of FFA is not already established, may meet, draw up a constitution not in conflict with the State Constitution, elect officers, set up a Chapter Plan, and then apply to the State FFA Advisor for affiliation with Florida FFA, Inc. and the National Organization. Upon receipt of a charter from Florida FFA, Inc., the local chapter and the members thereof will be recognized as a unit and members of Florida FFA, Inc.
- Section E Federations All activities of the FFA federation and members thereof shall be in harmony with the purposes, principles and ideals of the National FFA Organization.

ARTICLE III

Procedure for Determining Standing of Chapters and Members

- Section A A local chapter shall be considered in good standing with Florida FFA, Inc. when the following general conditions are met:
 - 1. All current state and national dues have been paid by a date to be specified by State Board of Directors.
 - 2. All reports have been submitted as required by Florida FFA, Inc.
 - 3. No provisions of the chapter constitution are in conflict with the State and National Constitutions or PL 105-225 (formerly PL 81-740). Activities are in harmony with the ideals and purposes of Florida FFA, Inc.
 - 4. The Board of Directors of Florida FFA, Inc. shall have the power to suspend local chapter charters upon receipt of evidence of infringement on the provisions of the State or the National Constitutions. A report on all suspensions shall be presented to the next succeeding State Convention.

In case any local chapter is not in good standing with Florida FFA, Inc. at the time of the opening of the State Convention, the delegates to the State Convention shall have the power, upon recommendation of the State Board of Directors, to withdraw the charter and refuse such chapter official representation in Florida FFA, Inc. Upon meeting the requirements for good standing, a chapter may be reinstated by action of the State Board of Directors, not earlier than 10 days after the closing date of the State Convention during which it was not in good standing.

In case a local department of agricultural education in which a chartered chapter of FFA is located is discontinued, the chapter so involved may be permitted to operate officially for a period not to exceed 36 months from date of the discontinuance of the department, providing proper supervision and guidance can be given to the chapter work by a person having the approval of the local school administrator and the State Advisor. Local chapter charters must be surrendered to the State Advisor at the end of the 36 month period, if a local department of agricultural education is not again in operation in the school at that time.

- Section B An active member shall be considered in good standing when:
 - 1. The member attends local chapter meetings while enrolled in the school where the local chapter is established.
 - 2. The member shows an interest in, and takes part in, the affairs of the chapter.
 - 3. The member pays dues regularly and conducts him/herself in a manner becoming a member of Florida FFA, Inc.

ARTICLE IV Membership 115 116 Membership in Florida FFA, Inc. shall be of four kinds: (1) Active; (2) Alumni; (3) Collegiate, and (4) Section A -117 Honorary. 118 119 Section B -Active membership. Any secondary student who is enrolled in agricultural education is entitled to become 120 an active member. 121 122 A member who is in good standing at the time of induction into the Armed Forces of the United States of 123 America or into the FFA international program, shall be in good standing during the period of induction 124 without further payment of dues or attendance at meetings. Time spent in the Armed Forces or FFA international program shall not be considered as elapsed time in determining the maximum period of four 125 126 conventions following graduation from high school or leaving high school. Members making use of this waiver of time for the purpose of maintaining active membership for application for advanced degrees must 127 128 resume active participation within six months after having been honorably discharged from military service 129 indicating such a desire by payment of dues and attendance at meetings. Members participating in the six 130 months' armed services program or participating in the FFA International program for six months shall be 131 eligible for one full year of extended membership. No individual, however, may retain active membership beyond the twenty-third birthday. 132 133 134 To be eligible for participation in the FFA contests and awards programs, a participant must meet one (1) of the following criteria: 135 136 137 Be an active, paid-up member of good standing in the local chapter for the school year during which the 138 contest is held and enrolled in agriscience and natural resources education. 139 140 Be currently enrolled or have completed one or more agriscience and natural resources courses offered in a program sequence during the previous year and be an active, in school, paid-up member of good 141 142 standing in the local chapter. 143 144 Be officially scheduled for or enrolled in agriscience and natural resources education during the current school year and be an active, paid-up member of good standing with the local chapter. 145 146 147 Be a high school graduate and retain active membership for four national conventions following graduation from high school (these members are not eligible to participate in judging contests with the exception of those 148 149 members on a state winning team as a graduating senior competing in national competition). 150 A member who is a former state winner, either individual or team, in a particular FFA contest or award is not 151 152 eligible to compete in that contest or award again. 153 154 Section C -Alumni membership. Following the termination of active membership status, a member becomes eligible for 155 active alumni membership. 156 157 Collegiate membership. Collegiate membership shall be open to students who are enrolled in agricultural Section D courses or who are pursuing career objectives in the industry of agriculture at a two- or four-year 158 159 postsecondary institution. 160 161 Honorary membership. Farmers, school superintendents, principals, members of boards of education, chapter Section E advisors, teachers, staff members in agricultural education, business people, and others who are helping to 162 advance agricultural education and the FFA and who have rendered outstanding service, may be elected to 163 164 honorary membership by a majority vote of the members present at any regular meeting or convention. 165 166 Honorary membership shall be limited to the Honorary Chapter FFA Degree in the local chapter and the 167

- 7. Show progress toward individual achievement in the FFA award programs.
- 8. Have a satisfactory scholastic record.
- 9. Submit a written application for the Chapter FFA Degree.
- 10. Meet other requirements as established by the chapter.
- Section E State FFA Degree To be eligible to receive the State FFA Degree from the state association the member must meet the following minimum qualifications:
 - 1. Have received the Chapter FFA Degree.
 - 2. Have been an active FFA member for at least two years (24 months) at the time of receiving the State FFA Degree.
 - 3. While in school, have completed the equivalent of at least two years (360 hours) of systematic school instruction in agricultural education at or above the ninth grade level, which includes a supervised agricultural experience program.
 - 4. Have earned and productively invested at least \$1,250, or have earned and productively invested at least \$150.00, and worked (other than class scheduled time) at least 376 hours, or a combination thereof, in a supervised agricultural experience program. Any combination of hours x \$3.33 plus dollars must be equal to, or greater than, the number 1402. Hours used for the purpose of producing earnings reported as productively invested income shall not be duplicated as hours of credit to meet the minimum requirements for the degree. Changes to the specifications by the National FFA Organization to earn the degree shall become effective at the time specified by the National FFA Organization, and shall be reported to the delegates at the next State Convention.
 - 5. Demonstrate leadership ability by:
 - a) Performing ten procedures of parliamentary law.
 - b) Giving a six-minute speech on a topic relating to agriculture or the FFA.
 - c) Serving as an officer, committee chairperson, or participating member of a chapter committee.
 - 6. Have a satisfactory scholastic record as certified by the local agricultural education instructor and the principal or superintendent.
 - 7. Have participated in the planning and completion of the Quality Chapter Plan.
 - 8. Have participated in at least five FFA activities above the chapter level.

The percentage of the total state membership which may receive the State FFA Degree and other requirements may be established by Florida FFA, Inc.

Written records of achievement of all requirements, verified by the chapter FFA advisor, shall be submitted to Florida FFA, Inc. at least one month prior to the state FFA convention at which the State FFA Degree is to be received. The state advisor shall provide for review of the records and submit a recommendation to the state association governing body, which shall nominate at the state FFA convention the candidates who have been found worthy to receive the honor. The State FFA Degree will be conferred upon the candidates subject to the approval by the delegates at the state convention.

284 American FFA Degree - To be eligible to receive the American FFA Degree from the National FFA 285 Section F -286 Organization, the member must meet the following minimum qualifications: 287 288 Have received the State FFA Degree, have been an active member for the past three years (36 months), and 289 have a record of satisfactory participation in the activities on the chapter and State levels. 290 291 Have satisfactorily completed the equivalent of at least three years (540 hours) of systematic secondary school instruction in an agricultural education program or have completed the program of agricultural 292 293 education offered in the school last attended. 294 295 Have graduated from high school at least 12 months prior to the national convention at which the degree is to be granted. 296 297 298 Have in operation and have maintained an outstanding supervised agricultural experience program 299 through which a member has exhibited comprehensive planning, managerial, and financial experience. 300 301 Have earned and productively invested at least \$7,500, or have earned and productively invested at least \$1,500 and worked 2250 hours in excess of scheduled class time. Any combination of hours x \$3.33 plus 302 303 dollars must be equal to, or greater than the number 9,000. Hours used for the purpose of producing earnings reported as productively invested income shall not be duplicated as hours of credit to meet the 304 minimum requirements for the degree. Changes to the specifications by the National FFA Organization 305 to earn the degree shall become effective at the time designated by the National FFA Organization, and 306 307 shall be reported to the delegates at the next State Convention. 308 Have a record of outstanding leadership abilities and community involvement and have achieved a high 309 school scholastic record of "C" or better as certified by the principal or superintendent. 310 311 312 ARTICLE VI 313 Procedure for Choosing Candidates for the American FFA Degree 314 Applications for the degree must be approved by the state advisor or representative/s thereof and, must be 315 Section A -316 received by the national organization not later than midnight of June 30, or show by postmark or other 317 reliable evidence, to have been mailed to the national organization on or before June 15, prior to the national 318 convention at which the degree is to be received. 319 Applications must be submitted on the official form provided by the National FFA Organization. 320 Section B -321 322 Section C -The National FFA Board of Directors shall review the American FFA Degree applications and recommend 323 those candidates meeting the minimum qualifications. Final approval of the candidates shall be given by the 324 delegates present at the national FFA convention. 325 ARTICLE VII 326 **Emblem** 327 328 329 The official emblem of Florida FFA, Inc. shall include five symbols, namely: (1) the plow, representing labor and Section A -330 tillage of the soil; (2) the owl, representing wisdom; (3) the rising sun, representing progress; (4) a cross-section of an ear of corn, representing common agricultural interests; and (5) an American eagle surmounting the cross-331 section of the ear of corn, representing the national scope of the organization. The emblem shall also include the 332 333 letters "FFA" and the words Agricultural Education. 334 335 Section B -The emblems shall be uniform in Florida FFA, Inc. and recognized units thereof. All members shall be 336 entitled to display the emblem. 337 338 Section C -Greenhand FFA Degree recipients shall be entitled to wear the official bronze emblem pin; Chapter FFA 339 Degree recipients shall be entitled to wear the official silver emblem pin; State FFA Degree recipients shall be

340 341		entitled to wear the official gold emblem charm; and American FFA Degree recipients shall be entitled to wear the official gold emblem key.

352 353	Section A -	The officers of Florida FFA, Inc. shall consist of a president, a secretary at-large, six vice presidents and a state advisor. The State Supervisor of Agriscience and Natural Resources Education shall be the State Advisor.
354 355 356 357		The FFA Director shall serve as the FFA Executive Secretary. There shall be a state FFA Board of Directors and Governing Board, as described in Article XIII of this Constitution.
358 359	Section B -	In the conduct of the business of the annual State Convention, each qualified delegate shall have one vote.
360 361 362 363 364	Section C -	Chapter officers shall consist of a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, reporter, sentinel, and advisor. Other officers may be designated if desirable. The local teacher of agricultural education shall assume the responsibilities of the local advisor. Officers of the local chapter shall be elected annually or semi-annually at a regular meeting of the local chapter.
365 366 367 368 369 370	Section D -	In order to be elected to a state office, a member must hold the State FFA Degree. An elected state officer is not eligible to participate in local FFA chapter activities, contests, or awards. After the chapter has been established in any given school for one year, officers in the local high school chapters must not rank lower than the Chapter FFA Degree. In schools having junior chapters, the chapter officers may hold the Greenhand FFA Degree.
371 372 373	Section E -	The state officer, for any given year, must be elected from the high school graduating senior class receiving the State FFA Degree either at the current year's state convention or at a preceding state convention.
374 375 376 377 378 379	Section F -	A sub-district chairperson shall be elected each year at the Sub-District Contest. The sub-district chairperson shall hold the rank of Chapter FFA Degree, except in a sub-district where all chapters are either junior or middle school chapters. The sub-district chairperson shall assume the duties of sub-district activities. A sub-district chairperson alternate shall be elected separately and is not to be the runner-up in the chairmanship voting. The sub-district chairperson and alternate chairperson shall be a junior or less and have one remaining year of eligibility in the sub-district the member is elected to represent.
380 381 382 383 384 385		The chairperson and alternate chairperson will be elected at the Sub-District Contest and shall serve as the sub-district chairperson-elect (alternate chairperson-elect) until the following state convention where they will then assume the responsibility of their elected office. 395 ARTICLE IX 396 **Duties of the State Officers** 397 President. It shall be the duty of the president to preside over the State Convention of Florida FFA, Inc., and 398 Section A -399 over all meetings of the one state convention each year, on such date and at such place as shall be fixed by a 400 majority vote of the State FFA Board of Directors. The president shall appoint all committees and may serve as an ex-officio member of these committees. 401 402 Secretary-at-Large. It shall be the duty of the secretary-at-large to keep minutes of the meetings of the state 403 Section B -404 FFA officers and the state convention, and perform other duties as directed by Florida FFA, Inc. Board of Directors and/or the FFA Executive Secretary. 405 406 407 Section C -Vice presidents. It shall be the duty of the six vice presidents, acting under the direction of the president, to look after the welfare of Florida FFA, Inc. the State. In case the office of president becomes vacant by 408 resignation or otherwise, the first vice president (who shall serve as the constitutional vice president) shall 409 410 assume the president's duties, followed, in turn, as occasion demands by the second, third, fourth, fifth, and 411 sixth vice presidents in the order named. 412 413 Second vice president. The second vice president shall assume the duties of the student-parliamentarian, and shall serve as a member of the State FFA Board of Directors, along with the other state officers. The second 414 vice president shall fill the place of parliamentarian in the ceremonies of Florida FFA, Inc. 415 416 417 Third vice president. The third vice president shall assume the duties of student treasurer. The student treasurer shall present to the delegates at the annual State Convention the treasurer's report. The third vice 418 president shall fill the place of treasurer in the ceremonies of Florida FFA, Inc. 419 420 Fourth vice president. The fourth vice president shall assume the duties of the student reporter, who shall be 421 422 charged with the responsibility of supplying news articles to various magazines, and otherwise publicize the activities of Florida FFA, Inc. The fourth vice president shall fill the place of reporter in the ceremonies of 423 424 Florida FFA, Inc. 425 Fifth vice president. The fifth vice president shall assume the duties of the student sentinel, who shall be 426 charged with the responsibility of preparing the meeting places and taking care of the FFA paraphernalia. 427 428 The fifth vice president shall fill the place of the sentinel in the ceremonies of Florida FFA, Inc. 429 430 Sixth vice president. The sixth vice president shall assume the duties of student chaplain and shall serve as a member of the State FFA Board of Directors, along with the other state officers. The sixth vice president shall 431 432 fill the place of chaplain in the ceremonies of Florida FFA, Inc. 433 The State Advisor. The State Advisor is an ex-officio member of the State Governing Board. It is also the 434 Section C -435 Advisors duty to advise the State FFA Board of Directors, delegates and committees on matters of policy, and assist the state officers in conducting meetings and carrying out programs. The State Advisor receives all 436 applications for the Florida State FFA Degree, and all American FFA Degree applications, to be submitted 437 from the State to the National Board of Trustees. The State Advisor shall prepare a report on the credentials 438 439 of the candidates for State FFA Degrees. 440 The FFA Executive Secretary. The duties of the FFA Executive Secretary shall be performed by the FFA 441 Section D -Director as designated by the State Advisor. The FFA Executive Secretary shall: 442 act as an agent of Florida FFA, Inc. and of the State FFA Board of Directors. 443 issue charters to local chapters, when ordered to do so by the State FFA Board of Directors. 444 keep records of the membership and progress of Florida FFA, Inc. 445 receive reports from local chapters, review them and inform the State FFA Board of Directors of any 446 proceedings which appear to be in conflict with the provisions of the State Constitution. 447 submit a budget of proposed expenditures to the FFA Board of Directors annually. 448 be in charge of arrangements for the annual State Convention, and may perform such other duties as 449 450 requested by the FFA Board of Directors.

451 The Executive Secretary shall work in cooperation with the state professional staff that supervises the state 452 453 program of agriscience and natural resources education, under the provisions of the National Vocational Education Act, or the Vocational Education Act of 1946 (Public Law 347, Sixty-fourth Congress, Public Law 454 455 586, Seventy-ninth Congress, and Public Law 88-210, Eighty-eighth Congress). 456 ARTICLE X 457 Procedure for Electing State Officers 458 459 460 Section A -The Screening Committee shall study and review the qualifications of each student member who is eligible and whose application has been approved by their chapter advisor for consideration as a state officer. This 461 462 committee shall report during the state convention. Election of officers shall require a majority vote. 463 Section B -The president and secretary at-large shall be elected from the membership at large and shall serve statewide. 464 465 The election of vice presidents shall follow a yearly rotational cycle. The area from which the second vice 466 467 president comes during the current year, shall be entitled to a first vice president the succeeding year, and so on for the other areas. 468 469 470 Section C -State officers shall be elected to serve from one state convention through the next succeeding state convention and state student officers shall not be re-elected, nor be eligible for election to another student office. If, in 471 the case of extreme emergency, a state convention is not held in any given year, the Board of Directors shall 472 have the power to appoint temporary officers to fill any office. The Board of Directors will also have the 473 power to fill vacancies which occur between state conventions. 474 475 476 Section D -State officers may be removed, suspended from official duties, or placed on inactive status for any documented reason that would prevent said officer from performing the duties of the office, for failure to 477 478 comply with conditions of the Oath of Office (attached and included as Appendix 1 to the Bylaws.), for 479 failure to abide by the FFA Code of Ethics (attached and included as Appendix 2 to the Bylaws.), for failure to 480 perform the duties of the office, or for commission of any act deemed to be illegal, unethical or immoral. The State FFA Executive Secretary and the State FFA Advisor shall consider all factors presented to them 481 regarding the conduct or condition of said officer. The State Advisor and Executive Secretary shall take such 482 action as shall be deemed to be in the best interests of the officer, the officer team, and the Florida FFA 483 484 Association. At the next regular meeting of the Governing Board, they shall report their actions regarding 485 removal or suspension of an officer or officers. The Governing Board shall have authority to ratify or reverse the actions of the State Executive Secretary and State Advisor. 486 487 488 ARTICLE XI 489 Meetings and Conventions 490 Section A -A State Convention of Florida FFA, Inc., shall be held annually, and at least 45 days prior to the National 491 Convention, except in case of an emergency declared by FFA Board of Directors. The time and place of 492 meeting shall be determined by the FFA Board of Directors. 493 494 495 Section B -Florida FFA, Inc. shall be entitled to send two official delegates to the National FFA Convention from it's its active membership plus additional delegates determined by the state's membership represented as a 496 497 percentage of the total national membership. Calculations shall be based on the previous year's active membership according to National FFA Organization membership records and a fixed national delegate 498 assembly of 475 delegates. The delegates shall be selected as provided in the By-Laws. 499 500 Section C -Each chapter is entitled to send two delegates from its active membership to the State Convention, such 501 502 delegates to be selected as provided in the chapter constitution or by-laws. One more than 50% of the delegates, at the rate of two delegates per chapter, must be present to constitute a quorum at the State 503 Convention. Also, a quorum for the State Convention shall be delegate representation from a majority of the 504 505 chartered and active FFA Chapters. 506

507 Section D -Local chapters shall hold their meetings monthly, or more often throughout the calendar year, and at a time 508 and place to be determined by the governing body of the local chapter. 509 510 ARTICLE XII 511 Committees 512 The president of Florida FFA, Inc. shall appoint regular committees annually. The first eight of the following 513 nine committees are Florida FFA Program of Work Committees. The ninth committee is a function of the 514 Screening Committee prior to the State FFA Convention. Alumni Relations Committee shall work closely with the Florida and National FFA Alumni and 518 shall propose changes and recommendations for the alumni organization. 519 The Audit Committee shall examine the books of the Treasurer. 520 2. 521 The Chapter Awards Program Committee shall propose ways of improving the Chapter Awards 522 3. 523 program (forestry, safety, co-op, etc.). 524 525 The Career Development Event Committee shall propose ways of improving Career Development 4. 526 Events and ideas for new Career Development Events. 527 The Marketing Committee shall propose changes for the betterment of the various FFA publication 528 5. 529 and other marketing strategies. 530 531 6. The Foundation Relations and Awards Committee shall work closely with the Florida FFA Foundation and shall recommend ways to improve the overall awards program and shall propose 532 changes and recommendations for the Florida FFA Foundation. 533 534 7. 535 The Program of Activities Committee shall set-up the annual objectives and goals of Florida FFA, 536 Inc., and suggest ways and means of attaining them. 537 The Resolutions and Changes Committee shall propose changes and redirection in the overall FFA 538 8. program and shall propose resolutions concerning those changes and/or resolutions to persons, 539 540 businesses or organizations as statements on behalf of Florida FFA, Inc. 541 542 9. The Screening Committee shall screen applicants for state FFA office and shall recommend to the delegate body those applicants qualified to run for State FFA office. 543 544 545 ARTICLE XIII 546 The FFA Board of Directors and The Governing Board 547 The FFA Board of Directors: 548 Section A -549 The FFA Board of Directors of Florida FFA, Inc. shall consist of the two state FFA officers, the State 550 551 Advisor (non-voting member), the FFA Executive Secretary, six teacher representatives(one from each 552 area), one agriscience education staff member from the state university system to be appointed by the 553 Advisor, the Executive Director of the Florida FFA Foundation, the President or designee of the Florida Association of Agriculture Educators, and the President or designee of the Florida FFA Alumni. The six 554 remaining state FFA officers shall serve as ex-officio non-voting members. Consultants (non-voting 555 556 members) from industry, supporters, and organizations deemed to have positive influence on Florida 557 FFA shall be appointed by the Board of Directors. Such consultants are valued for their advice and 558 support, and may offer comments during meetings of the Board of Directors, may serve as members of 559 committees, but shall not hold office on the Board of Directors. 560 561 The FFA Board of Directors shall assume the duties of conducting annual FFA activities. 562

563 The terms of office of the members of the FFA Board of Directors and the method of selection of such members, other than ex-officio members, are prescribed in the By-Laws. 564 565 Florida FFA, Inc. shall meet at least once each year, at such time and place as may be prescribed in the 566 567 By-Laws. Special meetings may be called at any time by the chairperson. 568 The officers of Florida FFA, Inc. Board of Directors shall be elected from the teacher representatives on 569 570 the Board of Directors, and have the power to authorize the seal of Florida FFA, Inc. to be affixed to all papers which may require it. 571 572 573 The quorum of the FFA Board of Directors shall consist of a majority of the voting members and a 574 majority of the ex-officio non-voting members. 575 576 Section B -The Governing Board: 577 578 The Governing Board of Florida FFA, Inc. shall be composed of: (a) the State Supervisor of Agriscience 579 and Natural Resources Education as the State Advisor, who shall serve as a non-voting member; (b) the President of the FFA Board of Directors who shall act as the chairperson; (c) the Secretary of the FFA 580 581 Board of Directors; (d) the Treasurer of the FFA Board of Directors; (e) the State FFA President, and the President-elect of the FFA Board of Directors and (f) the FFA Executive Secretary who will act as the 582 Secretary of the Governing Board. 583 584 585 The Governing Board, in the event of an emergency or if an issue arises that does not allow time for the 586 Board of Directors to meet, shall have and exercise the powers of the Board of Directors, subject to their 587 direction, and have the power to authorize the seal of Florida FFA, Inc. to be affixed to all papers which may require it, or to take such actions as are deemed to be in the best interests of the Florida FFA 588 Association. Any action taken shall be reported to the Board of Directors at its next meeting, and such 589 590 action is subject to ratification or repeal. 591 592 ARTICLE XIV 593 Dues 594 Annual membership dues in Florida FFA, Inc. shall be fixed by a majority vote of the delegates present at the 595 Section A -596 State FFA Convention. 597 598 Section B -The dues of any chapter shall be fixed by a majority vote of the membership of that chapter. 599 ARTICLE XV 600 601 Amendments 602 603 Section A -Proposed amendments to the State Constitution must be submitted in writing by authorized representatives of local chapters to the FFA office at least 45 days prior to the annual State FFA Convention. These proposed 604 amendments must be reviewed by the FFA Board of Directors which shall, in turn, submit them to the delegates at 605 the State Convention with recommendations. Amendments may be adopted or revisions made in the State 606 607 Constitution at any State FFA Convention by a two-thirds vote of the delegates. 608 Section B -609 By-Laws of the State Constitution may be adopted by the FFA Board of Directors to fit the needs of Florida FFA, Inc. or any unit thereof, provided they are not in conflict with the State or National Constitution. These 610 adoptions or changes shall be reported to the delegate body at the next regular convention. 611
